Staff's better use of time to be used on multiple day events like Classic Cars in August. Too many factors like weather and other events in the communities. If the weather is nice, people come down anyways.
- Easter and Halloween are single day events but not a lot of money is put towards those events. Around \$5,000.
- Try and incorporate the businesses more into these events.
- Portchella was going to be a one weekend or one day event which will probably change based on what happened at Spring in the Port.
- Culture Days also falls in the Autumn. Working with Cody Evans on Classic Cars in terms of contacting the bands and getting permits. Received a grant for \$10,000 for that event. Stephen Dasko will help but we might have to pay for the permits this year which will take a good chunk of the money. Don't want to sacrifice paying the bands for this event.
- We were looking at an influencer company but feel it wasn't necessary right now, but possibly down the road.
- The mural images have been put up at the LCBO parking lot. Thank you to Stephen Dasko on his support of the arts. Special mention to Ann for rearranging the order of the images. It is a great transition for the rest of the images.
- Councillor Dasko, with classic cars, should have some flyers or something letting them know the benefits of this event, encouraging them to stay open for a couple more hours, or putting out tables and chairs. Flyers could go in the windows of the shops. Ann Ivy Male and Cody Evans are going to check in with all the businesses and let them know about the event.
- When the budget conversations come around, we go to every committee and staff and ask for a wish list. But the budget has to be the budget. This year hopefully will have more people involved with the budget. Added a column for events.
